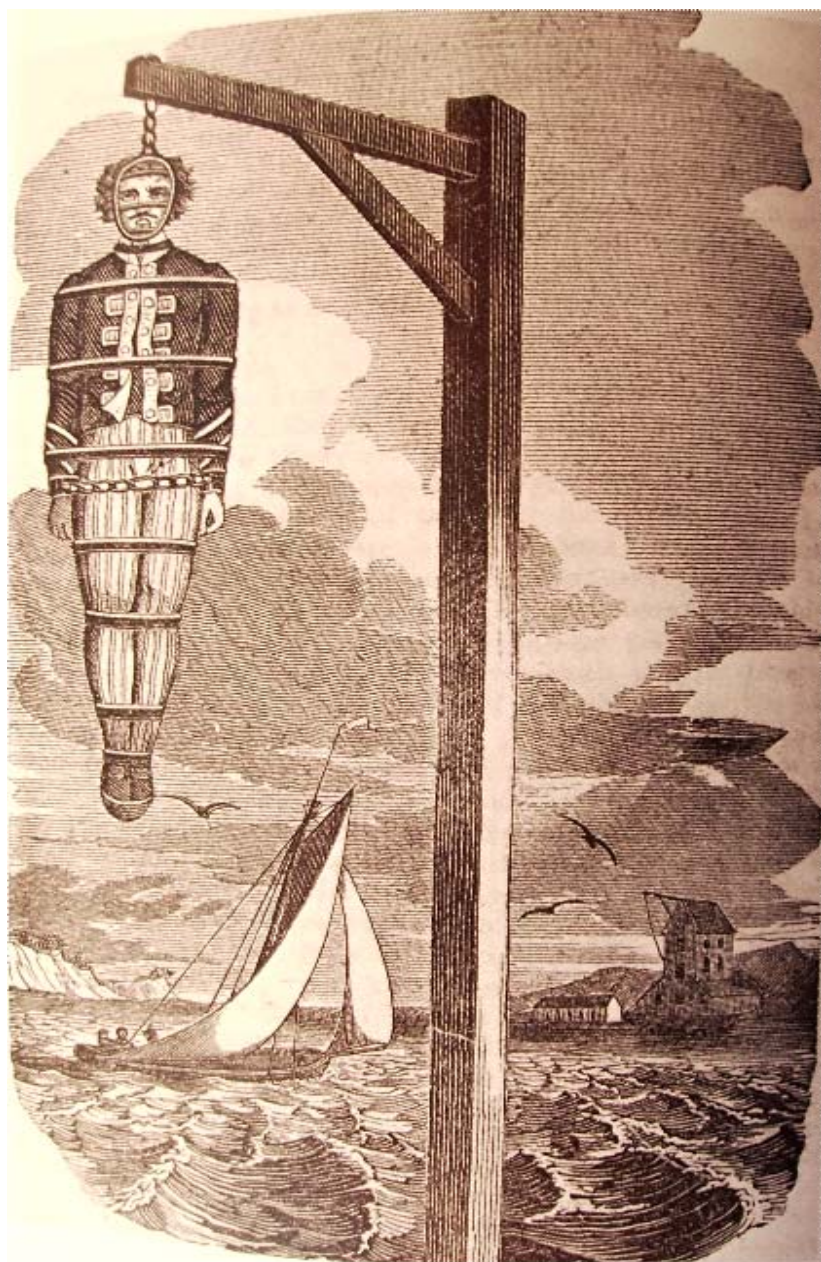


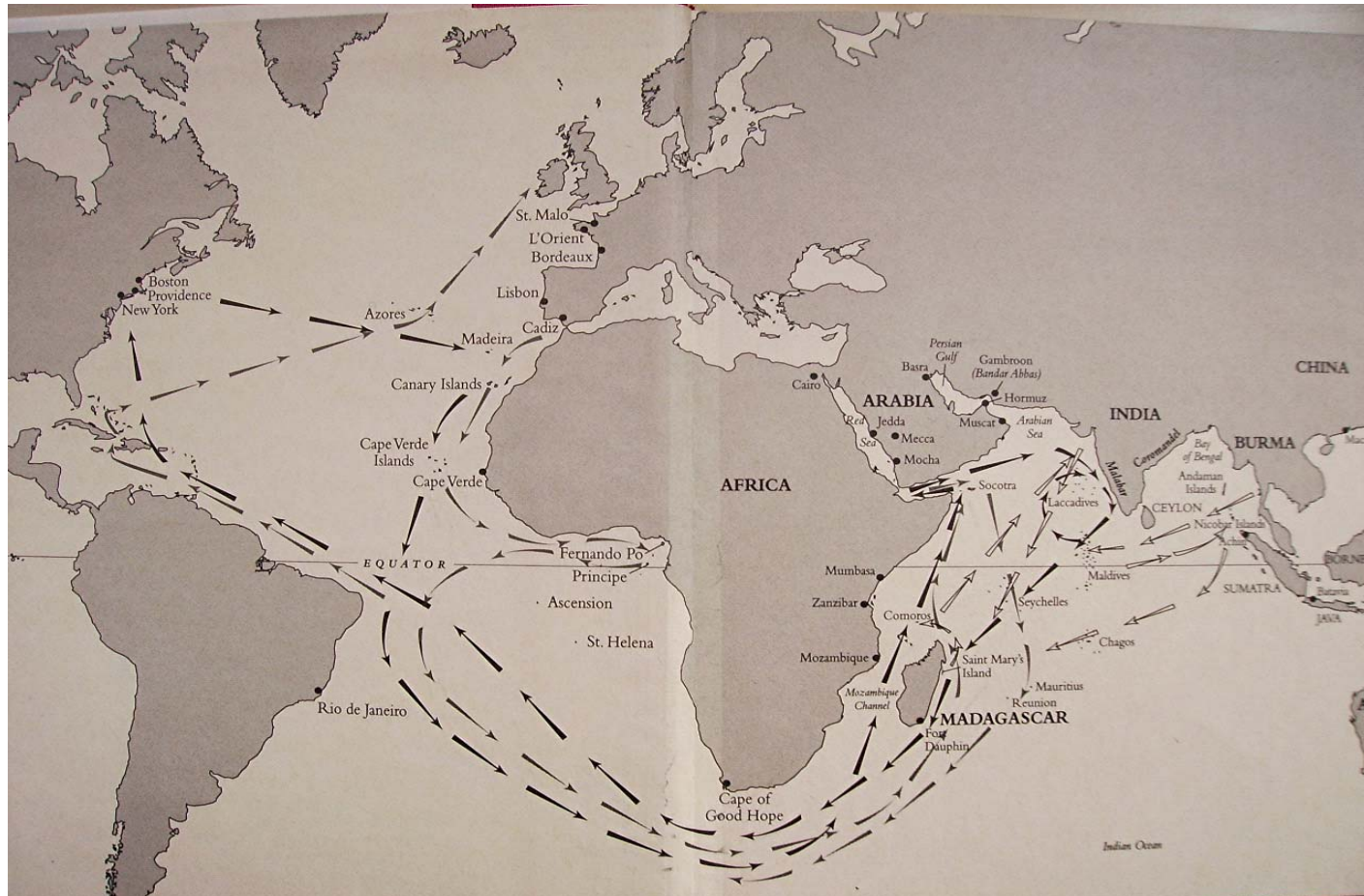

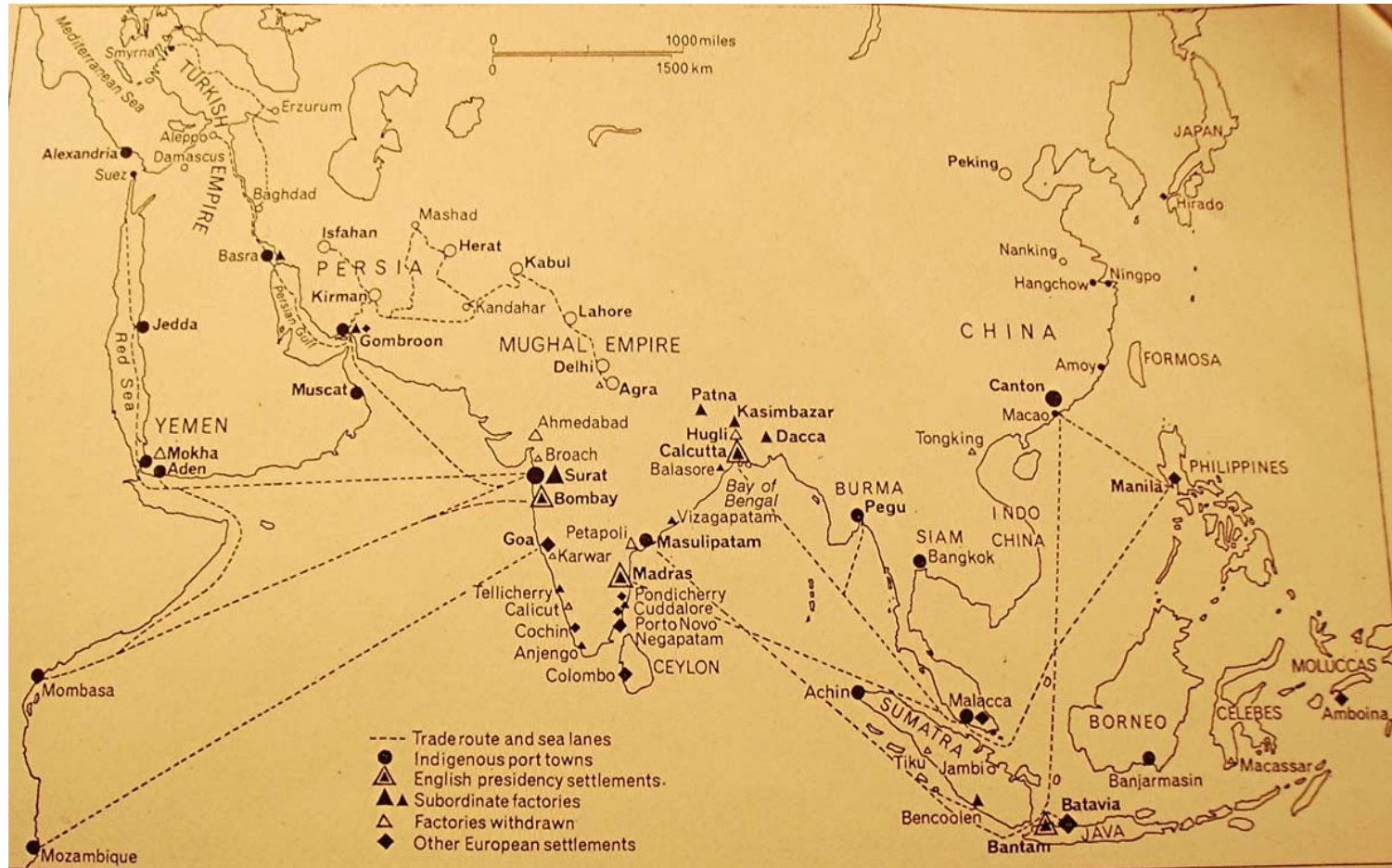

1. Von der Karibik nach Madagaskar und in den Indischen Ozean. Die „Piratenrunde“ und globale Seeräubervernetzung um 1700



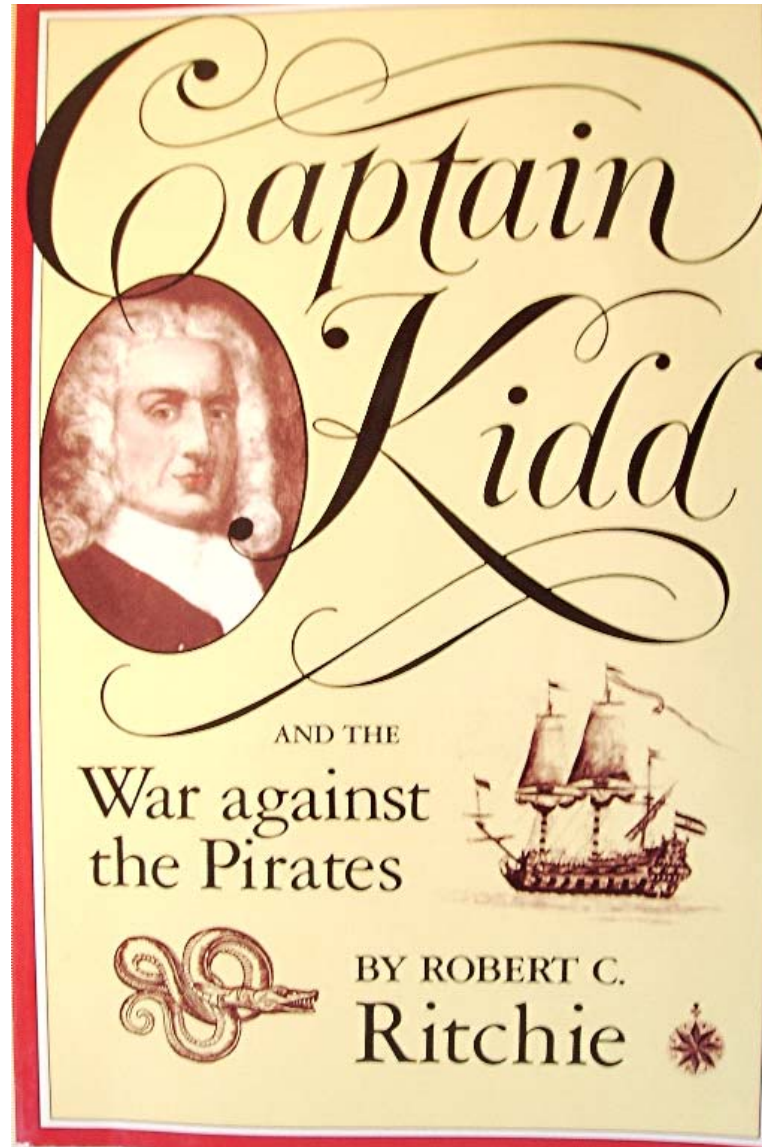
Internationaler Handel im Indischen Ozean um 1700



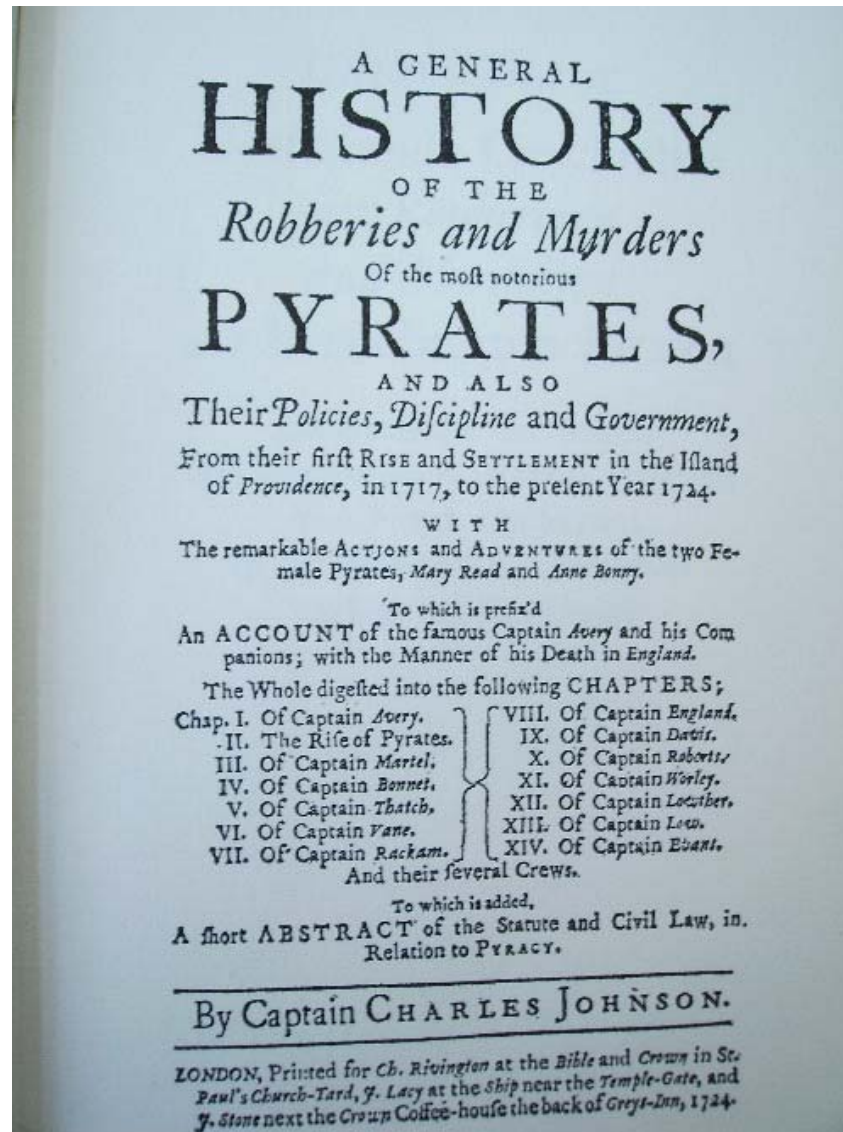

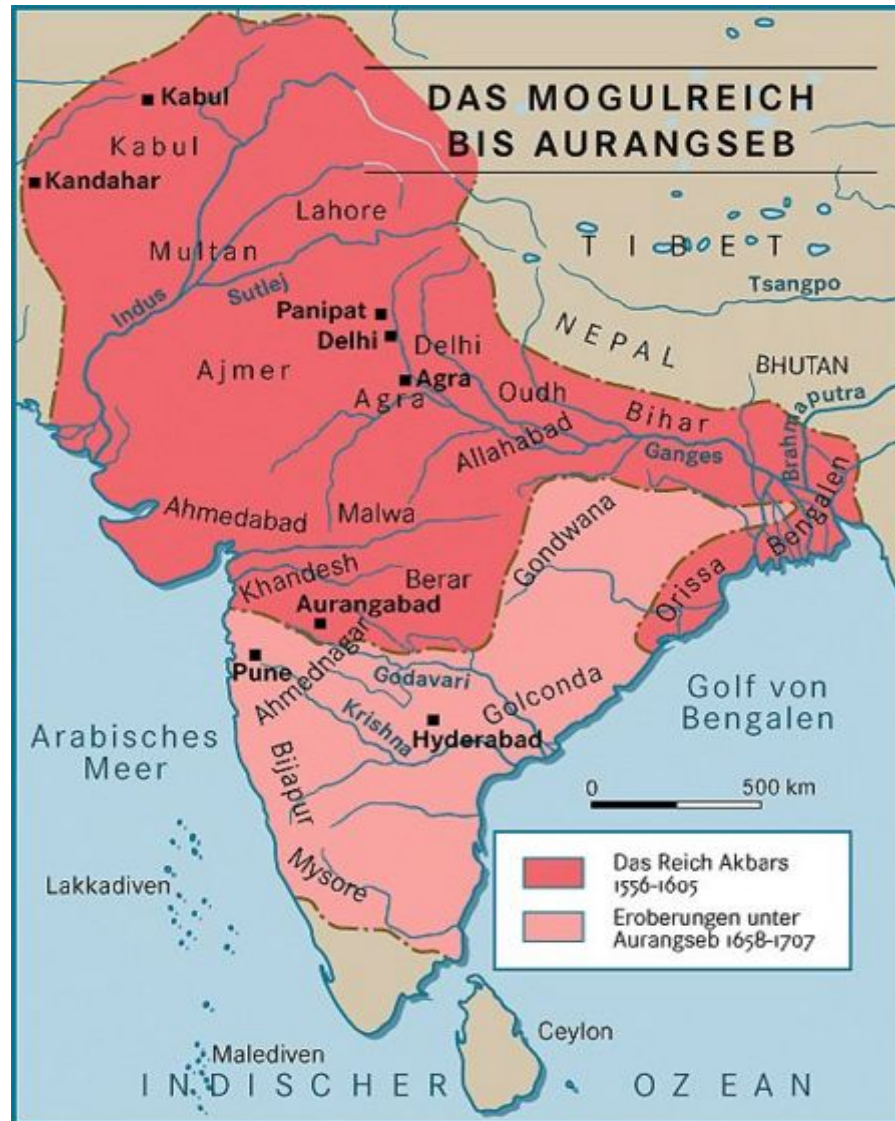
